Glimpse of a single Father: In 2019, Lee was a single father with full care of his son and struggling to survive without a permanent home. That year in September, he was awarded a Housing Choice Voucher (HCV). The HCV allowed him to rent a home and begin his journey toward establishing a secure foundation for his family.

In December 2020, Lee joined the Family Self-Sufficiency Program (FSS). He had big goals and was determined to reach them! First was to obtain gainful employment so he would be able to support his family. His goals included cleaning up his credit and paying off debts so he could purchase a reliable car and one day, to buy a house.

Soon after joining FSS, Lee was able to find full-time employment and begin his journey toward financial independence and self-sufficiency. For the next two years, he worked diligently to improve his employment situation and improve his credit score. By the end of February 2023, he had not only achieved his FSS goals, but had exceeded even his own expectations by getting to the point that he no longer qualified for assistance.

By making use of his degree in Applied Science, Lee now has a great career with an engineering firm and has established a pattern of goal achievement and successful living. He expects to be in a position to purchase his own home in 2024.

FINANCIAL HEALTH: CREDIT

BY KATIE ISOLA Tips to Improve Your Credit Score



Most people run into credit scores when renting an apartment, buying a car, or applying for a credit card or a loan. It is a score that tells lenders how financially reliable you are at paying your debts. People in the credit business will tell you that credit is a game, and with every game comes rules. The credit rules are hard to find but once you are aware of them, it becomes easier to play the game and understand what is happening. Below are a few credit tips to help improve and keep your credit score high.

There are many credit score calculators and theories about what is best in regard to credit building and knowing your score, however, most lenders (90%) will use your FICO score. Your score on other systems will be comparable no matter the credit score system they are using (Transunion, Experian, or Equifax). FICO scores range from 300-850. The closer you are to 850 the better, however, if you have at least a 740 you will most likely get a "yes" on most things you ask for and there is no need to try to achieve a higher score.

One way for someone to boost their credit is to be added as an authorized user to someone else's credit card. We usually see this with parents and their children, but spouses, partners and friends can also do this for one another. By being an authorized user, you will inherit their good credit from whichever card you are an authorized user on. However, please keep in mind that this sword cuts both ways; If you are an authorized user on a credit card of someone who does not have good credit, you will inherit their bad credit as well.

It is always best to pay off your credit card balance monthly, no matter how big or small your balance is. It is a misconception to keep a small balance on your credit cards. Only the credit card companies want you to keep a balance because if you don't have one, they have no way to make money off you. A manageable way to do this is to only use 30% of your allowed credit. For example, if you have a \$1000 limit on your credit card, try to never spend more then \$300 on that card and pay it off monthly. Spending over 30% of your credit limit can hurt your credit. If you want to increase your score you will need to spend less then 30% because that shows that you don't need all of their credit which makes your score go up.

Lastly, you should only have about 3-5 lines of credit. That would be a car payment, a credit card, a student loan, etc. If you have more than that, it's not necessarily bad if you are managing them well, but it can get out of control fast and quickly turn problematic and unmanageable.

You can access more information and pull your credit reports by going to www.annualcreditreport.com. You are able to get a free credit report from each of the 3 credit bureaus one time per year. You can also access them individually through each of the credit agencies: Equifax, Transunion and Experian. Your scores will be slightly different depending on where you look.

FICO scores are provided free by the following credit cards: American Express, Bank of America, Citi, Discover, and Wells Fargo. If you don't have an eligible credit card from one of the issuers above, you can still access your free FICO Score with Experian Boost.
